NEW FUNDING PACKAGE IMPROVES ROADS, BRIDGES, AND PUBLIC SAFETY

Warmer weather is just around the corner, and no matter where you live or travel in Pennsylvania, you're going to see many more road and bridge projects springing to life.

It's all because state lawmakers did something last fall that had been talked about for years. Following Gov. Tom Corbett's lead, they enacted a \$2.3 billion transportation funding package that's expected to greatly improve public safety, create jobs—up to 50,000—and encourage business growth and development.

And while this is good news for Pennsylvania, it's even better news for municipalities which are responsible for more road miles—77,000—than the state Department of Transportation, which oversees 44,000 miles.

Secretary of Transportation Barry Schoch says it was time for the commonwealth to move forward with a spending plan. "Ultimately, we have a responsibility for public safety," he says, "and had to choose whether to make the investment now or continue to put it off for future generations."

BENEFITS SPREAD FROM LOCAL ROADS TO STATE HIGHWAYS—No doubt, the new revenues will make a marked difference in our township and others, many of which, faced with rising transportation costs and stagnant state funding, had been slapping band-aids on roads and bridges for decades to prolong their life.



This new funding package, however, will deliver a two-thirds increase in the annual liquid fuels payments that municipalities receive.

This state funding, which helps our township pay for road projects and purchase materials such as salt, will increase by \$237 million annually after the law is fully enacted in five years.

Significantly more money is in the pipeline, too, to improve dirt, gravel and low-volume roads, aging bridges, and outdated traffic signals. A high prevailing wage threshold for local road and bridge projects, another key provision in the funding package, will also enable townships to save money and schedule

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NOTICE REGARDING RIGHT-OF-WAYS

The Board of Supervisors and the State Police ask that you please observe the right-of-ways when farming or landscaping (most right-of-ways are 16.5 feet from the center of the road onto the property of the land owner).

This will help avoid site distance problems at intersections, erosion into road gutters and allow the township to properly maintain road edges, clean road gutters and mow the road banks.

General Elections are always held the first Tuesday, after the first Monday, in November, which falls on November 4, 2014 this year.

FROM THE ROAD DEPARTMENT



Hopefully spring is finally here. Our average for plowing and salting roads is 22 times per year. This year we have been out 47 times. Needless to say its been trying at times with breakdowns and salt shortages. I'm looking forward to warm weather so we can continue with road projects.

We estimated bid quantities for this year's bids for aggregate, asphalt, road oil, seal coat, guide rail, equipment rental, and tree trimming services (2014 Liquid Fuels budget). We also requested bids for services for Drumore Park (2014 General Fund budget). The request for bids was advertised in March and the bids were awarded at the April 3, 2014 Board of Supervisors regular business meeting.

We also advertised the sale of our 1986 International S2550 Township dump truck as the new township truck that we ordered in August 2013, a 2014 Peterbilt Tandem dump truck with plow and spreader, finally arrived in late January of this year.

Following is a summary of the road projects we have planned for this year:

- ♣ Fernglen, Park & Lake View Drives—mill and place aggregate and superpave materials with road widener and paver as needed to perform widening, base repair and paving, including bituminous curb.
- ♣ Guide Rail—install guide rail on River Road, Scalpy Hollow Road & Sunnyside Drive.
- ♣ Gutter Cleaning & Tree Trimming—on various township roads.
- ♣ Seal Coat—portion of Bald Eagle Road & Oregon Hollow Road & Drumore Township Park.
- ♣ Skin Patching—approximately four (4) tanks of road oil for sealing cracks in various township roads.

*Municipalities: The Commonwealth allocates one-half cent of the tax collected on each gallon of liquid fuels to a special fund known as the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund. The allocation of these funds to municipalities is based on the ratios of mileage and population of the municipality to the state totals, and the revenues must be used on the roads and streets for which the municipalities are legally responsible. That is, 50% of the funds are distributed based on a municipality's proportion of local road mileage to the total local road mileage in the state, and 50% on the proportion of a municipality's population to the total population of the state. A municipality's local road mileage is verified by periodic road surveys conducted by the Bureau of Municipal Services of the Department of Transportation. Municipalities should report mileage changes (Form MS-990) to the district Municipal Services office by September 1st of each year, so that mileage changes can be reviewed and credited to the municipality for the following year.

**After the road is turned back to the municipality, PennDOT provides money to the municipality each year to cover the costs associated with maintaining the roadway at a rate of \$4,000 per mile. PennDOT releases annual maintenance payments on March 1, two years after the year of transfer.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR RESIDENTS OF DRUMORE TOWNSHIP

REQUIREMENT TO FILE A LOCAL EARNED INCOME & NET PROFITS TAX RETURN BY APRIL 15, 2014



Any person who resides in either Lancaster County or the Octorara Area School District in Chester County during any part of a given year and who received either earned income or net profits during that year is **REQUIRED** to file a Local Earned Income & Net Profits Tax Return with the Lancaster County Tax Collection Bureau – or “LCTCB” – for that year. There are no exceptions to the requirement. Thus, you must file a return even if you filed quarterly returns for the year, your employer withheld the tax from your paycheck, and even if you do not owe any tax. Generally, the tax return is due on or before the April 15 following the year being reported in the return. Very importantly, you **must** file an annual tax return even if you do not receive a tax return form or other notice from LCTCB.

It is also **STRONGLY RECOMMENDED** that any person who resides in either Lancaster County or the Octorara Area School District in Chester County during any part of a particular year – but who did not receive earned income or net profits during that year – also file an annual return noting “no income” **IF** the taxpayer was required to file an annual return for the year preceding the year in which no income was earned. That information will provide LCTCB with notice that interest, penalties, fines, and collection costs (late fee) should not be assessed against the taxpayer.

Quarterly Tax Return and Payment Requirement—In addition to the annual tax return filing requirement, any person who is otherwise required to file an annual return and who is either self-employed or does not have the tax withheld from his or her paycheck must file quarterly tax returns and make quarterly estimated tax payments. However, the quarterly return filing requirement does not apply to individuals with an annual income of less than \$25,000. A person who is required to file on a quarterly basis shall file quarterly returns and make quarterly tax payments 30 days after the end of each calendar quarter. For 2014, a quarterly tax payment is due on April 30, July 30, and October 30 of 2014 and January 30, 2015.

If you have additional questions about quarterly filing and quarterly estimated tax payments, please consult the LCTCB Earned Income and Net Profits Tax Regulations posted at www.lctcb.org and also your professional advisors.

Consequences for Failure to File—If you are required to file an annual or quarterly tax return and you either fail to do so or the tax return is postmarked after the due date, you will be subject to interest and penalties for any tax you failed to pay by the due date AND a \$25 late fee to cover the costs incurred by LCTCB in identifying, pursuing, notifying you of, and processing your late return.

Extension of Time to File an Annual Tax Return—LCTCB grants annual tax return filing extensions if LCTCB **receives** an extension request **on or before** the original due date for the return.

You can make an extension request by submitting any of the following to LCTCB on a timely basis: (1) a copy of your extension request to either the Internal Revenue Service or the Pennsylvania Department of Revenue for the tax year at issue; (2) a copy

of documentation establishing the IRS or Department granted you an extension for the tax year at issue; or (3) marking the “Extension request” box under “Check all that apply” on the LCTCB annual return form for the tax year at issue with an “X” and returning the marked form to LCTCB with the necessary information to identify you.

Very importantly, filing an extension request does **not** extend the time to pay any tax due. **In that respect, LCTCB follows the practice of the Pennsylvania Department of Revenue.** 61 Pa. Code § 117.14(a). Accordingly, if you file an extension request, you **must** include with the request an estimated payment equal to what you believe you will owe for the tax year at issue. All such payments must be made based on reasonable estimates. Guidance as to what constitutes a reasonable estimate can be found in LCTCB Earned Income and Net Profits Tax Regulation Section 404.

If you file an untimely extension request, make an untimely payment of estimated tax, or make a timely payment of estimated tax based on an unreasonable estimate of tax liability, you will be subject to interest and penalties for any tax you failed to pay by the due date AND a \$25 late fee to cover the costs incurred by LCTCB in addressing your particular circumstances.

General Information—If you filed a paper return last year with LCTCB you will receive a return and instructions in the mail. If you filed electronically last year you will receive a postcard which will include your PIN to file electronically this year. Failure to receive a tax return, postcard or other notification by mail does not relieve you of your obligation to file an annual return.

You are encouraged to file your return electronically by using LCTCB eFiling available through the website at www.lctcb.org. Successfully completing a return online will give you an instant confirmation number that your return has been submitted and that you can use as a reference in future communication with LCTCB. If payment is due, you must also complete the payment step in the online process or you will be charged interest, penalty, and a late payment fee.

If you mail a paper return using the USPS, you are encouraged to keep a copy of your signed return. Failure of the USPS to deliver your return may result in a late filing fee charge to you.

If you use a tax preparer please note that most preparers do not mail the local tax return for you, mailing the return is your responsibility. If the preparer tells you that your local return was filed electronically, be sure to request a copy of the confirmation form for your records.

LCTCB is a non-profit, independent organization established by the school districts and municipalities of Lancaster County to collect local earned income taxes. LCTCB is not a part of the Lancaster County government offices. The Lancaster County government offices will not be able to assist you with the filing of your local earned income tax return.

CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER'S CORNER

The long awaited stormwater management ordinance will be adopted by the Board of Supervisors on May 1. The regulations will change the permitting process in Drumore Township for most zoning and building permits. All properties will be given 1000 square feet of allowable impervious improvements. This exemption will be tracked with each permit application. Please keep in mind most types of earth disturbance and all new impervious area proposed will require a stormwater permit. This includes, but is not limited to, small sheds, patios, driveways, walkways, greenhouses and farm buildings.

We have developed a process in accordance with the approved DEP regulations to streamline applications that propose less than 5000 square feet of impervious and less than 5000 square feet of earth disturbance. This type of application can be completed by the property owner with the aid of the Township.

The major stormwater plan, which proposes greater than 5,000 square feet of impervious, must be prepared by a qualified professional and all requirements in the ordinance must be addressed.

We will post the adopted stormwater ordinance, submission forms, required fees and the small project design guidelines on the website in early May. Any questions may be directed to my office at Solanco Engineering.

Building permit fees are based on the fee schedules of the Drumore Township Third Party Inspection Agencies listed above. Drumore Township shall also collect \$4.00 for each building permit issued and 10% of the building permit review and inspection fees as permitted by Act 45 Uniform Construction Code, as amended.

IMPORTANT BUILDING & PERMIT INFORMATION

A Zoning Permit is required for most activities with a cost in excess of \$1,000. Please call the Zoning Officer for additional information.

A Building Permit is required for all new construction and alterations to a structure. The building permit issuance and inspections are conducted by either Municipal Solutions or Commonwealth Code Inspection Services, Inc. They can be contacted with questions regarding the Uniform Construction Code.

A Highway Occupancy Permit is required for construction of a new access or alteration of an existing access to either a Township or State roadway (Route 272).

A Building Permit is not required for:

- ♣ A detached residential accessory structure less than 1,000 square feet of usable floor area.
- ♣ Agricultural structures.
- ♣ Retaining wall not exceeding 4 feet in height.
- ♣ Swimming pool less than 24 inches deep.
- ♣ Deck (uncovered) less than 30 inches from existing grade.

The following information is required for submission of a Building Permit application:

- ♣ Completed application.
- ♣ Three (3) copies of all information (plans & specifications).
- ♣ Payment of the permit fees prior to issuance.
- ♣ A Sewage Permit (new construction or alteration that changes sewage flows).
- ♣ A soil erosion and sedimentation control plan for any earth disturbance activities. Additional information can be obtained by calling the Lancaster County Conservation District @ 717-299-5361.

The following information is required for the submission of a Zoning Permit application:

- ♣ Completed application.
- ♣ Payment of the permit fees.
- ♣ Sketch showing location and nature of improvements.
- ♣ A soil erosion and sedimentation control plan for any earth disturbance activities. Additional information can be obtained calling Lancaster Conservation District at 299-5361.
- ♣ An Individual NPDES Permit if the earth disturbance exceeds one acre and there is a point source discharge from the construction activities.
- ♣ Notification of approval from the Lancaster County Conservation District for Manure Storage Facilities.
- ♣ A Highway Occupancy Permit is required for construction of an access to either a Township or State Roadway (Route 272).

Drumore Township will charge a fee of \$25.00 (twenty—five dollars) plus bank charges, administrative fees and any other fees and charges incurred by the municipality for any check that is returned to the Township due to insufficient funds, an account being closed, or for any other reason. The Township has the right to refuse payment by check from anyone who has previously had a check that was returned to the Township.

Right to Know Fees:

Specialized documents including, but not limited to, blue prints, color copies, and non-standard sized documents shall be charged the actual cost of production. If mailing is requested, the cost of postage will be charged. The Township shall require prepayment.
