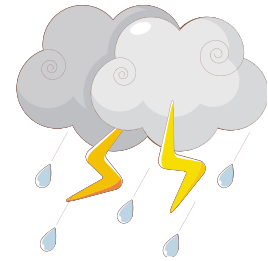




CHANGING STORM WATER MANAGEMENT REGULATIONS



The much talked about draft model storm water management ordinance has now been approved by the Department of Environmental Protection. This approval now mandates that all municipalities must adopt an ordinance which is consistent with the model ordinance by August 4, 2013. This will have significant impact on the permitting process in Drumore Township. Storm water management facilities will be required for ALL new impervious area (impervious surfaces are mainly artificial structures such as pavements—roads, sidewalks, driveways and parking lots—that are covered by impenetrable materials) and there will be no exemptions as previously thought. Please note this also applies to agricultural structures as well as residential and commercial construction.

To expedite the process and in an effort to keep costs to a minimum for the residents, the Township will be developing a standard set of methods to control storm water for small projects. These small projects will not require the resident to hire an engineer to design a plan for submission to the Township. The requirements will be handled at the permitting stage with the Township staff. Larger projects will require the resident to obtain the assistance of a professional who will design a plan to meet the complex regulations. We do understand that there will be a period of transition and your understanding and patience is greatly appreciated as we proceed forward with these new regulations.

SIGNS, SIGNS, EVERYWHERE SIGNS

All signs, with the exception of real estate signs on the actual property for sale, require a permit from the zoning officer. Signs on utility poles or signs located within the Township or State

road right of way are generally not permitted. Signs advertising produce or goods sold at a roadside stand also require a permit and are limited by the zoning requirement. Illegal signs will

be removed from road right of ways and other illegal signs will subject the owner to possible fines and penalties if not removed as requested. Your help in policing this issue is much appreciated.

In Pennsylvania's Primary Elections, voters choose their party's nominees to run in the General Election by casting ballots. Primary elections in Pennsylvania are held on the third Tuesday of May in all years except Presidential years, when they are held on the fourth Tuesday of April. General Elections are always held the first Tuesday, after the first Monday, in November, which falls on November 5, 2013 this year.

FROM THE ROAD DEPARTMENT



We estimated bid quantities for this year’s bids for aggregate, asphalt, road oil, guide rail, equipment rental, and tree trimming services (2013 Liquid Fuels budget). We also requested bids for a 2011 or newer 4 wheel drive industrial rubber tire loader/backhoe and services for Drumore Park (2013 General Fund budget). The request for bids was advertised in March and the bids will be awarded at the April 4th Board of Supervisors regular business meeting.

The following road projects are planned for this year:

- ♣ **Furniss Road**—mill to widen roadway and place & roll 25mm superpave in widened area from River Road to Susquehannock Drive (10,575’) and mill existing pavement and place & roll 25mm superpave in various locations for base repair from Susquehannock Drive to pipe near Scalpy Hollow Road (6,730’)
- ♣ **Guide Rail**—install guide rail on Susquehannock Drive
- ♣ **Gutter Cleaning & Tree Trimming**—on various township roads
- ♣ **Skin Patching**—approximately four (4) tanks of road oil for sealing cracks in various township roads

The Board of Supervisors and the State Police ask that you please observe the right-of-ways when farming or landscaping (the right-of-way is 16.5 feet from the center of the road onto the

property of the land owner). This will help avoid site distance problems at intersections, erosion into road gutters and allow the township to properly maintain road edges, clean road gutters and mow the road banks.

*Municipalities: The Commonwealth allocates one-half cent of the tax collected on each gallon of liquid fuels to a special fund known as the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund. The allocation of these funds to municipalities is based on the ratios of mileage and population of the municipality to the state totals, and the revenues must be used on the roads and streets for which the municipalities are legally responsible. That is, 50% of the funds are distributed based on a municipality’s proportion of local road mileage to the total local road mileage in the state, and 50% on the proportion of a municipality's population to the total population of the state. A municipality's local road mileage is verified by periodic road surveys conducted by the Bureau of Municipal Services of the Department of Transportation. Municipalities should report mileage changes (Form MS-990) to the district Municipal Services office by September 1st of each year, so that mileage changes can be reviewed and credited to the municipality for the following year.

**After the road is turned back to the municipality, PennDOT provides money to the municipality each year to cover the costs associated with maintaining the roadway at a rate of \$4,000 per mile. PennDOT releases annual maintenance payments on April 1, two years after the year of transfer.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR RESIDENTS OF DRUMORE TOWNSHIP

REQUIREMENT TO FILE A LOCAL EARNED INCOME & NET PROFITS TAX RETURN BY APRIL 15, 2013



ALL individuals who resided in Lancaster County or the Octorara Area School District in Chester County for all or part of 2012 **AND**

had earned income or net profits in 2012 are **required to file a Local Earned Income & Net Profits Tax Return** with the Lancaster County Tax Collection Bureau (LCTCB) each year **by April 15.**

Failure to file a Local Earned Income & Net Profits Tax Return by April 15 may result in additional costs including interest, penalties and late fees. You **must** file a tax return even if your employer withheld the correct tax amount and no tax is due. If your return indicates an amount due, sending a payment coupon and check **does not meet** the requirement of filing a return.

If you filed a paper return last year with LCTCB you will receive a return and instructions in the mail. If you filed electronically last year you will receive a postcard which will include your PIN to file electronically this year. **Failure to receive a tax return, postcard or other notification by mail does not relieve you of your obligation to file an annual return.**

You are encouraged to file your return electronically by using the LCTCB eFiling application available through the website at www.lctcb.org. If you mail a paper return using the USPS, you are encouraged to keep a copy of your signed return. Failure of the USPS to deliver your return may result in a late fee charge to you.

If you use a tax preparer please note that most prepar-

ers do not mail the local tax return for you, mailing the return is your responsibility. If the preparer tells you that your local return was filed electronically, be sure to request a copy of the confirmation form for your records.

Additional information on who must file, how to file, and where to file your Local Earned Income Tax Return is available at the Lancaster County Tax Collection Bureau website – www.lctcb.org. If you need additional assistance, you may contact LCTCB **by mail** at 1845 William Penn Way, Lancaster, PA 17601, **by email** at info@lctcb.org, or **by phone** at (717) 569-4521. Please note there may long wait times during tax season if you select the phone option.

LCTCB is a non-profit, independent organization established by the school districts and municipalities of Lancaster County to collect local earned income taxes. **LCTCB is not a part of the Lancaster County government offices. The Lancaster County government offices will not be able to assist you with the filing of your local earned income tax return.**

ONLOT SEWAGE MANAGEMENT

We are starting the second pumping cycle and the Township greatly appreciates the high percentage of properties that were pumped and inspected in compliance with the ordinance. Please remember that you, the property owner, are responsible to obtain the proper inspection report from the pumper and mail it to the Township. This has been somewhat of an issue for some pumpers and unfortunately the residents are ultimately responsible for the actions of the pumper. Also, please remember there is no fee for the sewage inspection report submission as the Supervisors eliminated the administrative processing fee for the next round of pumping.

Unfortunately, the Township was required to take court action against approximately 12 properties to obtain compliance and a few have been delinquent in the second pumping cycle. The cost to the property owner in these cases was more than the cost to pump and comply. The administrative cost can be eliminated for all future pumping cycles if the number of non-compliant properties are reduced or eliminated.

Also, please remember there is no fee for the sewage inspection report submission as the Supervisors eliminated the administrative processing fee for the next round of pumping.

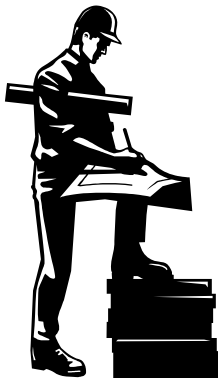

A Zoning Permit is required for most activities with a cost in excess of \$1,000. Please call the Zoning Officer for additional information.

A Building Permit is required for all new construction and alterations to a structure. The building permit issuance and inspections are conducted by either Municipal Solutions or Commonwealth Code Inspection Services, Inc. They can be contacted with questions regarding the Uniform Construction Code.

A Highway Occupancy Permit is required for construction of a new access or alteration of an existing access to either a Township or State roadway (Route 272).

A Building Permit is not required for:

- ♣ A detached residential accessory structure less than 1,000 square feet of usable floor area
- ♣ Agricultural structures
- ♣ Retaining wall not exceeding 4 feet in height
- ♣ Swimming pool less than 24 inches deep
- ♣ Deck (uncovered) less than 30 inches from existing grade

The following information is required for submission of a Building Permit application:

- ♣ Completed application
- ♣ Three (3) copies of all information (plans & specifications)
- ♣ Payment of the permit fees prior to issuance
- ♣ A Sewage Permit (new construction or alteration that changes sewage flows)
- ♣ A soil erosion and sedimentation control plan for any earth disturbance activities. Additional information can be obtained by calling the Lancaster County Conservation District @ 717-299-5361.

A Highway Occupancy Permit is required for construction of an access to either The following information is required for the submission of a Zoning Permit application:

- ♣ Completed application
- ♣ Payment of the permit fees
- ♣ Sketch showing location and nature of improvements
- ♣ A soil erosion and sedimentation control plan for any earth disturbance activities
- ♣ An Individual NPDES Permit if the earth disturbance exceeds one acre and there is a point source discharge from the construction activities
- ♣ Notification of approval from the Lancaster County Conservation District for Manure Storage Facilities
- ♣ A Highway Occupancy Permit is required for construction of an access to either a Township or State Roadway (Route 272)

Drumore Township will charge a fee of \$25.00 (twenty—five dollars) plus bank charges, administrative fees and any other fees and charges incurred by the municipality for any check that is returned to the Township due to insufficient funds, an account being closed, or for any other reason. The Township has the right to refuse payment by check from anyone who has previously had a check that was returned to the Township.

Right to Know Fees:

Paper copies shall be 25 cents per page per side. The certification of a record is \$1 per record. Specialized documents including, but not limited to, blue prints, color copies, and non-standard sized documents shall be charged the actual cost of production. If mailing is requested, the cost of postage will be charged. The Township shall require prepayment.
